Bootcamp/Help Nights: October is a busy month as students work to finalize their college application components. In addition to

their individual college counseling meetings, members of the Class of 2024 will have the opportunity to benefit from help during the Application Bootcamp on Oct. 13. All seniors/PGs should report to the Ong Library by 9 a.m. We are also holding three more Application Help Nights on **10/19, 10/25, 10/30**, 7-8:30 p.m., in the Wilson Reading Room.

Application submission (general): The month of October brings the first round of major application deadlines, with Oct. 15 serving as an early action deadline for several major universities. As we make our way through the next few weeks, students should make sure they are attending regularly scheduled college counseling meetings to review essays and applications. Students may also wish to submit their first application with their college counselor, which is certainly an endeavor we can support. As a friendly reminder, please do not wait until the last minute to submit an application. While the deadline is technically 11:59 p.m. on the stated date, we strongly encourage students to submit at least 24-48 hours in advance.

Application submission (specific logistics): Please remember that students must fill out an Application Processing Form and check to ensure their Maia Learning "Applying" list is accurate to ensure that all intended applications are accounted for. Students are responsible for submitting the following: college application and official score reports (when submitting scores and when official reports are required by a college). The College Counseling Office will submit the following: high school transcripts (WRA and previous schools, when applicable), letters of recommendation (teachers and counselor), WRA school profile and mid-semester grades (see below for more information).

Mid-Semester Grades for Early Deadlines: Mid-semester grades will be sent in support of students' applications to all Early Action and Early Decision colleges/universities with deadlines between 10/15/23 – 12/1/23. These grades will close on 10/27/23 to ensure timely processing. Please note that this grade report is not a required document for application deadlines and will be accepted by colleges and reviewed prior to admission decisions being released.

Testing Guidance: As test-optional admission policies continue, it is important for students to pay close attention to this component of their process. We have prepared this <u>helpful tips document</u> to share reminders about whether to submit scores or not along with general information regarding the reporting of scores to colleges in cases when students decide to submit. Please take some time to carefully review the information included and be in touch with your counselor if you have questions.

FAFSA and CSS Profile: The <u>CSS Profile</u> opened on Oct. 1 for the 2024-25 application cycle. There are schools and scholarship programs that <u>require the form</u> so be sure to check schools' websites for more information. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will be available in December. If your family plans to apply for need-based financial aid, these forms are the two most common that will be required. It is important to consult the financial aid websites of the colleges to which you/your student are applying for more specific information about required documentation and deadlines.

Method Learning (test prep): All members of the Class of 2025 have

received information for how to access their Method Learning accounts. Method Learning is our partner for delivering online, self-paced standardized test preparation for both the ACT and SAT to all members of the Class of 2025 at WRA. Counselors will be working closely with students on developing an individual testing schedule when formal college counseling meetings begin later this fall. For now, make sure you know how to log in before then working to complete the SAT and ACT evaluation tests.

Standardized Testing

Digital PSAT

Tomorrow, Friday, October 13, the Classes of 2025 and 2026 took the new digital PSAT. Ben Neely, the Chief Research and Impact Officer at Revolution Prep, has created a short video for students regarding changes to the PSAT and how the new digital format will affect them. This will continue to be helpful information as students prepare for the digital SAT which will replace the paper version starting in March, 2024. Please access the video here.

Desmos Calculator

The <u>Desmos Calculator</u> is a tool that students can expect to use on the digital SAT. It is a free online calculator that is part of a larger teaching and learning platform. Test takers will use the graphing calculator feature, which is standard for all high school students. Students should familiarize themselves with this calculator ahead of taking the SAT so that they know what to expect. <u>Linked here</u> is more information on how to download and practice with Desmos on Ohio State Assessments as well as information on the calculator's accessibility features.
